Here's a quick summary of how we're putting the CPF into action. Do not hesitate to contact us if you want more detail or have any questions.

- Students wear masks at all times indoors (if you can see the sky above you, you can take off your mask).
- Outdoors, masks can be removed (if you want), but make sure that you maintain distancing (if you can flap your wings (arms folded) and contact someone you're too close). Teachers will be reminding you if you're too close by mentioning the 'daylight rule' (if we can't see daylight between, you're too close).
- Rooms are to be ventilated as much as the weather conditions allow. Therefore, dress warmly.
- Teachers may choose to run some periods outdoors to give an extra breath of fresh air.
- Continue the hygiene rules we put in place last year e.g. catch sneezes in elbows, wash hands etc.
- Don't come to school if feeling unwell. See the previous letters home or ring the office for further instructions.


#### Ms Blake

# **Driver Simulation**

Mackenzie College is privileged to be a trial school for G-Factor's CoDriVR driver simulation device. We have been selected along with Roncalli College and Ashburton College to beta-test their awesome equipment.

The current education module uses simulations of South Canterbury roads to teach students how to approach intersections. Students are given guidance and feedback on how safely they responded to gaps in the flow of traffic, for example: "You could have made that turn safely but, it may have caused other drivers to become anxious."

More modules are being produced and uploaded to the device as the first module is trialled and feedback is received.



Booking for this device will be available to senior students next week.

# **The Dean Team 2022**
