NZQA and School Assessments

On Wednesday I spoke to our senior students in assembly to re-iterate the rules around school assessments. These rules are dictated to us by NZQA and are there to provide consistency across all schools in NZ.

The key points are:

If a student misses an assessment due to sickness on the day of the assessment, then they must provide a medical certificate for the assessment date

If the sickness is due to covid (and /or isolation) please inform school asap.

If a student has a prior and unavoidable commitment eg doctor, dentist or specialist appointment then this will be communicated to the teacher prior to the assessment and the teacher involved will do their best to work with the student to ensure that they are not dis-advantaged. This does not include driving lessons/tests, hair appointments, helping at home

The best thing is for there to be early and clear communication between staff, students and whanau.
